Joe Orton Still causing controversy



A campaign to raise money for a statue in memory of the 1960's playwright Joe Orton has hit its target of £115,000. The Leicester born writer, who penned, Entertaining Mr Slone and Loot. He was murdered by his lover aged 34, in 1967. The statue that has the support of Sir Ian Mckellen, Dame Sheila Hancock, Stephen Fry, Choreographer Mathew Bourne and Niell Tenant of the Pet shop boys. Was planned for Orton Square at the Leicester's Curve Theatre.

But this has hit a snag!

When even a cultural giant who is venerated by the left is cancelled what hope for common sense now?

As the statue of Joe Orton's scrapped amid a row over his sex life, is anything safe? The cancel culture police force have now cancelled a planned statue of the gay 1960's playwright a long time hero to liberals, all because of his preference for teenage boys in Morocco and elsewhere.

A cancelled statue, this time before it has even been erected. A statue of an admired LGBT playwright and an icon of the gay community, cancelled by his own admirers. So to coin a phrase made popular during the great terror in revolutionary France, "The revolution devours its own children".

The statue was to be the first in Britian to commemorate an openly gay working class man. But because, in his diaries Joe Orton mentions his preference for young teenage boys in Morocco and elsewhere and that he would sometimes pay for sex with teenage boys that some are saying that he must have been a paedophile.

Yes in Britain at this time, homosexuality was illegal, but in Morocco a more relaxed approach and for decades Tangier and other Moroccan cities were magnets for Gay tourists. The differential in wealth between foreigners and Moroccans created a thriving market in prostitution.

IN his diary, Joe Orton recorded a conversation at the Café de Paris in 1976. Orton was sitting at a table with friends beside a "rather stuffy American and his disapproving Wife". To further stoke their disapproval, the playwright began to talk about a sexual encounter. When one of those at the table reminded Orton that the tourist could hear ever word, he replied "they have no right to be occupying chairs reserved for decent sex perverts".

Times have moved on, The age of consent in many countries is now between 16 and 18 you have to move on and not wallow in past events as if they are as of today.
