As a member of GayWest you have access to the groups website so just to update you on how to get the most from it read on.


If you have not added the site to your homepage or bookmarks or favourites when you first logged in with your membership number here is a reminder of what to do.

On your device search for www.gaywest.org.uk in your selected browser.

When the home page of the site appears on your screen (see photo) go to your bookmarks etc. icon and save to your device, now you always have the site.

Gainsborough Films

Espied on YouTube during the Christmas festivities 2022 was a curious film offering, entitled Chu Chin Chow. It featured such luminaries as Fritz Kortner, George Robey, Anna May Wong and Pearl Argyle and it proved to be an astonishing and spectacular British Musical on the grandest of scales: In monochrome with huge sets, lavish costumes, dozens of songs, vast crowds, and all in an excellent digitised version!

It followed more or less the story of Ali Baba who with his forty thieves strove to steal from the rich to help the poor.

There is an element of human trafficking in the form of slave trading and there are a few gutchurning scenes along with thematic background, music especially composed by Frederic Norton and played by a symphonic orchestra.

This delicious romp runs for 1 hour 43 minutes, was made at the Gainsborough Studios, in London and was directed by Walter Forde. Even more surprising, was the year of production: 1934 sometime well before I was even born!

There are some memorable scenes incorporated into the screenplay –including the revolving capstan, the gruesome disposal of the forty thieves, and the uncanny appearance of a hand from someone buried alive! There is the grandest of finales – worthy of anything churned out from Hollywood in the same era. With the main characters assembled in the Calif's palace chamber, at least forty chorines suitably dressed in diaphanous-costumes appear and dance in the style of the seven veils.

Many more illustrious films followed later from the studios, but alas in 1951 the film company went into administration and the film complex was eventually demolished: nowadays a block of flats bearing the name Gainsborough stands on the site.

In my Quest for nostalgia, I have looked at relevant images on-line and hope one day I will be able to visit the once famous site and pay homage to the wonderful films that emerged from its hallowed walls.

Lenten-rose

Helleborus orientalis, commonly known as the Lenten-rose. It derived this common name from when the plant became available to buy in the UK in the 50's-60's, after an explosion of plant breeding. In the 50-60's the winters were much colder than they are today and these plants would come in to flower just before or during Lent.

Helleborus orientalis comes from the region of Turkey and through to Greece. All Hellebores belong to the family Ranunculaceae – the buttercup family.

Helleborus orientalis is an evergreen herbaceous perennial. It produces large palmate shaped, dark green, leathery leaves up to approximately 18 inches high from the ground. They produce large saucer shaped flowers. The flowers are either white, yellow, green, pink and shades of light to very dark/blackish reds. The flowers are also single, double or anemone centered. These plants are non-fussy and will grow in any well drained soil in the full sun or shade.

The flowers occur from as early as January. Once the flowers are seen emerging from the ground the current leaves should be cut away to allow clusters flowers to emerge. They can grow up to 18 inches height. Shortly after the flowers start emerging the new leaves will start to come through. In some varieties the leave can have a blackish tinge to them. Remove the flower stems in May, as they will go brown and unsightly within the plant.

Although there are many named varieties of Lenten Rose, I tend to find that they are bought for the color and type of flower....


